Compiled by:
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To plan future developments it is essential to have accurate information on the area, its assets, and its liabilities. Clonroche Development Association Ltd, with a view to future and better planning produced this analysis to highlight beneficial and problematic areas in our community.

The survey covers the Electoral Division of Clonroche including Clonroche village, townlands of Coolroe, Chaple, Ballymackessey, Tomfarney, Tominearly etc. This edition also covers the townlands of Coolaught, Castleboro, Ballyboro etc. (the area voting in Courtnacuddy) omitted in the previous survey because of electoral boundaries and lack of information; however both townlands form an integral and important part of the area.

Statistics are available for the year 2006, which are the latest figures we have to work with, but will be accurate enough to build a demographic profile

We hope this survey will be beneficial to planners, business men who may be interested in creating employment in the area, for the local authorities to better understand the needs of the area, and for European bodies who are interested in helping with the development of rural areas.

The area of Electoral Division of Clonroche is ?? and contains a population of 1152. The area is eight miles from Enniscorthy, sixteen miles from Wexford, twelve miles from New Ross and twenty six miles from Waterford.

Population Survey 2010

The last Survey conducted by Clonroche Development Association Ltd was in 1999 based on census figures for 1996. In the intervening ten years a tiny increase in population has occurred despite ten years of the Celtic Tiger. This would suggest the area is not attractive or viable to hold the younger generation

In this Survey figures are available for Castleboro which was not included in the 1999 publication

Family Units

There are 521 family units in the area, Castleboro with 222 and Clonroche with 299. The shift to smaller family size is evident with 34% of families comprising of two persons. Three & four person families represent 22% & 23% respectively with just 6% having six or more persons
